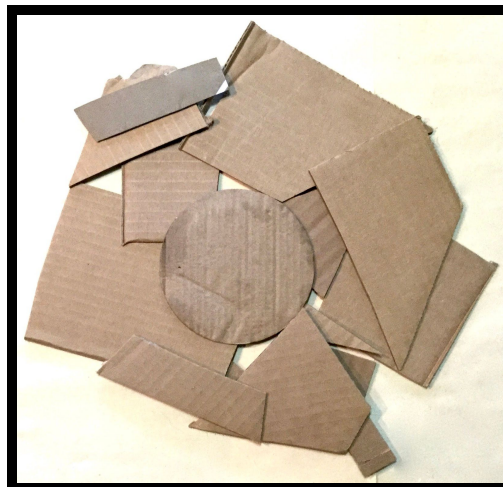


CARDBOARD CREATIONS

By Teaching Artist Steve Brouse / Grades K through 2

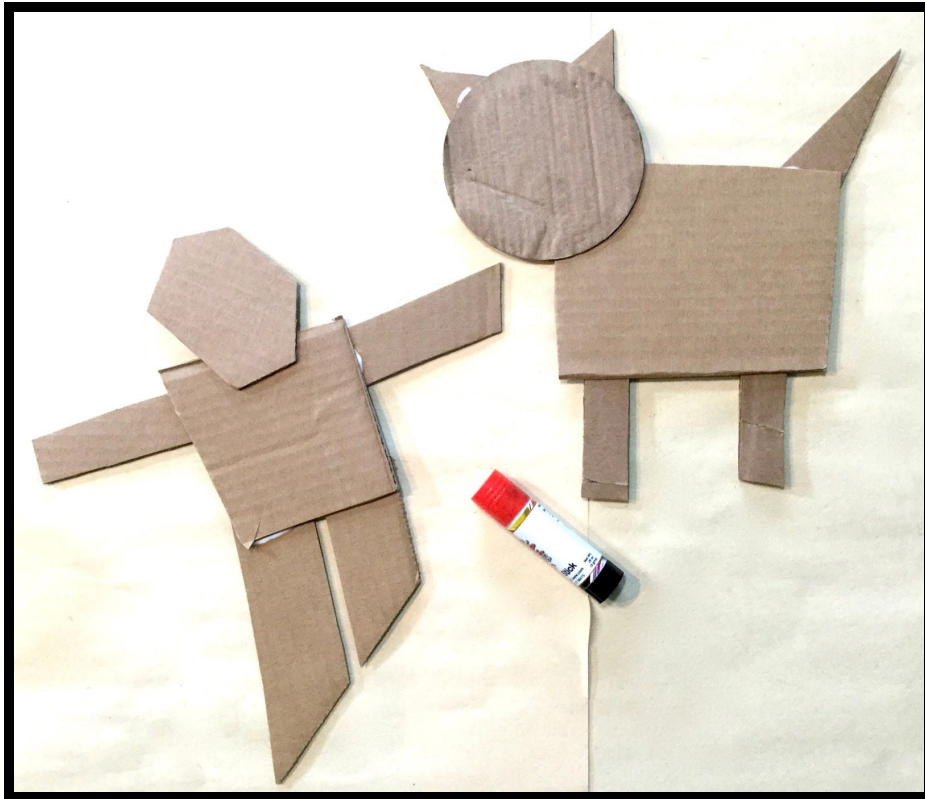


Cardboard is fun for children to get creative with and brings a new dimension to be explored. Watch as the child's two-dimensional skills become more three-dimensional. Combined with free reign of recycled goods such as magazine scraps, yarn and beans you will be amazed at their prized and innovative works of art.



Materials

- Cardboard Shapes (Parents/guardians, you might need to cut out shapes for the project.)
- Scissors (for adults)
- Gluestick
- Recycled Materials (buttons, yarn, beans, foil, cloth, magazines, etc.)
- Colored Markers and/or Crayons



Get excited and motivate children to explore by combining different shapes to create new things. Ask questions such as “What do you see?” You will see them become more inspired and happy to do the project. Try it and encourage creative thinking!
