You will need:

White paper

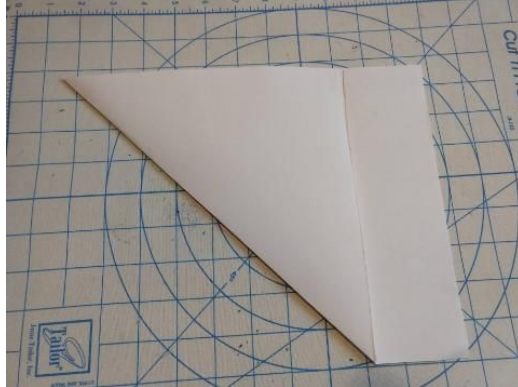
Colorful paper

Crayons, markers or colored pencils

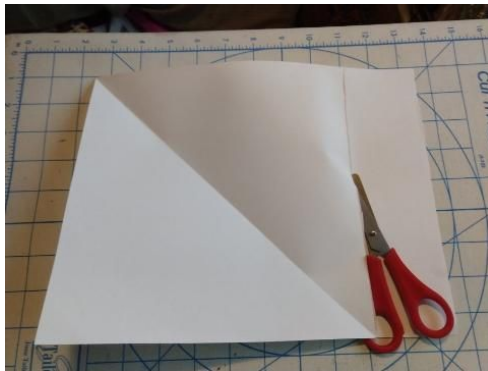
Glue stick

Scissors

First take a piece of paper and fold it like this:



Draw a line where the paper ends then cut along your line.



Think of a kindness you have shown to someone else. Draw a picture of what happened!



Now glue that picture to a larger piece of paper.



And the last step is to add other scraps of paper and/or drawings to decorate your quilt block!



How do you feel about your Kindness Quilt block?

Can you think of other acts of kindness?

How big can your Kindness Quilt grow?
