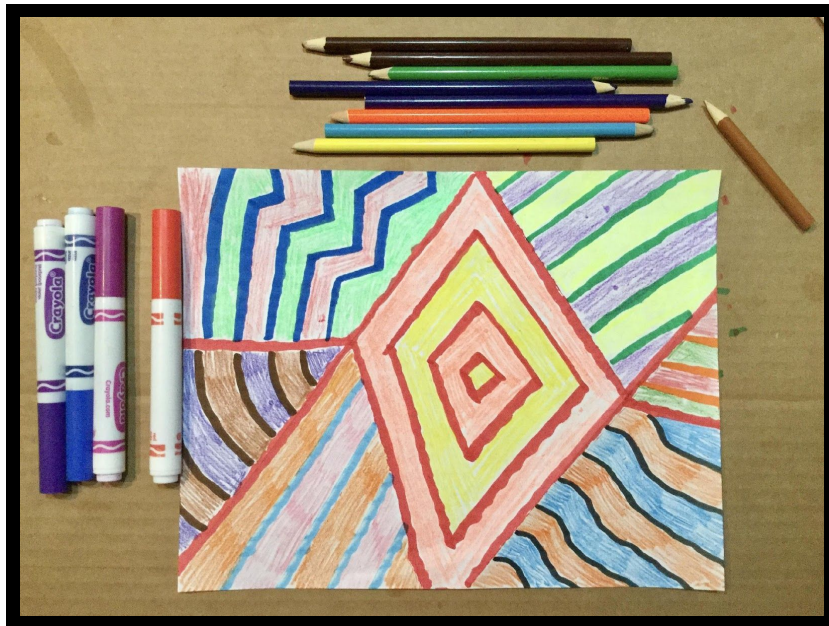


Op -N- Pop

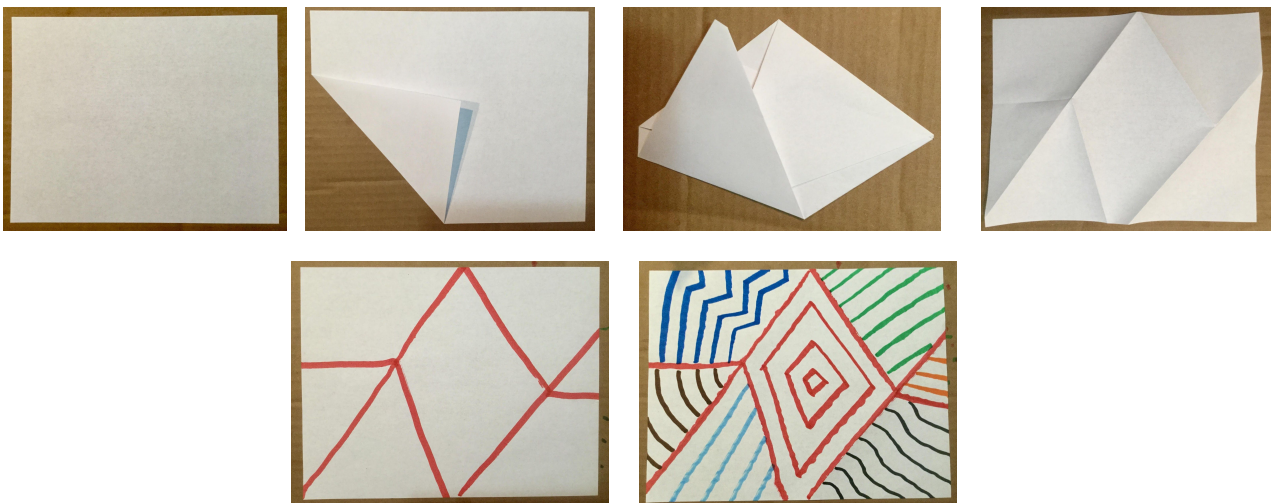

Op art, short for **optical art**, is a style of visual art that uses optical illusions. Op art works are abstract, with many better known pieces created in black and white. Typically, they give the viewer the impression of movement, hidden images, flashing and vibrating patterns, or of swelling or warping. Let's take it a step further and watch the shapes "Pop" with color!

Materials and Steps:

- 1.) Copy Paper - Fold paper at various angles (approximately 5 times).
- 2.) Markers - Outline folds with markers and draw random lines to create patterns (ex. wavy, zig zag, straight).
- 3.) Colored Pencil - Color in and enjoy the process.
